Healthy Mothers Lead to Healthy Communities

Mothers must make high-stakes decisions that affect their entire family's health and well-being every single day. From navigating life in a food desert, to choosing schools and nurturing happy, healthy families, moms must balance family finances, work and their own mental health. AltaMed is here to help.

To prevent the family unit from falling into crisis, the **AltaMed Women and Children Committee** is working to create a safety net for mothers in our community. As part of this effort, the Committee seeks to provide essential prevention practices that will help increase positive health care outcomes and sustain a network of innovative and accessible community programs.

Expanding advanced prenatal care and mammography imaging services within clinic walls is part of this effort. Making these vital services widely available in the communities we serve reduces the burden on women to seek care far from where they work and live.

Many children were forced to stay out of the clinic setting during the early onset of the pandemic, causing a probable delay in necessary appointments, vaccinations, and wellness assessments. We must prioritize addressing the most pressing needs of children—from closing gaps in pediatric services and assessing social drivers of health to focusing on early childhood development and literacy. Enhancing the health and human services available to our young patients, including migrant children, is also essential to improving overall community health outcomes.

In order to create real change in the overall well-being of our communities, we must make strategic investments in the caregivers who make the important decision in the health care needs of the family.
